

# Student Application Guidelines

## 1 Programs and number of students to be admitted

(If the number of accepted applicants is less than the number of available spots, an additional call for applications may be held. If an additional call for applications is conducted, details of student recruitment will be posted on the websites of Aichi University of Education and Cooperative doctoral course in subject development in late December or later.)

## 2 Eligibility

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:

1. Applicants who hold a master's degree or a professional degree (meaning a professional degree as prescribed in Article 5-2 of the degree regulations (ordinance of the Ministry of Education no. 9 of 1953) pursuant to Article 104, Paragraph 1 of the School Education Act (Act No. 26 of 1947); the same shall apply hereinafter), or who are expected to obtain such a degree by March 31, 2027.
2. Applicants who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree in a foreign country, or who are expected to obtain such a degree by March 31, 2027.
3. Applicants who completed coursework offered through correspondence education by a foreign school while residing in Japan and were awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree, or who are expected to obtain such a degree by March 31, 2027.
4. Applicants who have completed a graduate-level program at an educational institution in Japan that is recognized within a foreign country's educational system as having a foreign graduate school program and is separately designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, and who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree or a professional degree, or who are expected to obtain such a degree by March 31, 2027.
5. Applicants who have completed a program at the United Nations University established pursuant to the United Nations General Assembly resolution of December 11, 1972, as stipulated in Article 1, Paragraph 2 of the Act on special measures concerning the implementation of the agreement between the United Nations and Japan regarding the United Nations University headquarters (Act No. 72 of 1976), and who have been awarded a degree equivalent to a master's degree, or who are expected to obtain such a degree by March 31, 2027.
6. Applicants who have completed an educational program at a foreign school, an educational institution described in item 4 above, or the United Nations University, and who have been recognized as having academic abilities equal to or higher than those of a holder of a master's degree by passing examinations and screenings equivalent to those prescribed in Article 16-2 of the standards for the establishment of graduate schools (Ministry of Education ordinance no. 28 of 1974), or who are expected to be so recognized by March 31, 2027.
- 7\*. With regard to admission to the latter three-year phase of a doctoral program, applicants designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as having academic abilities equal to or higher than those of a holder of a master's degree or a professional degree (Ministry of Education notification no. 118 of 1989).
  - (1) A university graduate who has engaged in research at a university, research institute, or similar institution for two or more years and who, based on research achievements or comparable accomplishments, is recognized by the cooperative doctoral course in subject development as having academic abilities equal to or higher than those of a holder of a master's degree.
  - (2) An applicant who has completed a 16-year educational curriculum in a foreign country, or who completed

such a curriculum through correspondence education offered by a foreign school while residing in Japan, and who has thereafter engaged in research at a university, research institute, or similar institution for two or more years, and who is recognized by the cooperative doctoral course in subject development as having academic abilities equal to or higher than those of a holder of a master's degree based on research achievements or comparable accomplishments.

- 8\*. In the cooperative doctoral course in subject development, an applicant who is recognized as having academic abilities equal to or higher than those of a holder of a master's degree or a professional degree through an individual preliminary review of application qualifications, based on outstanding research achievements deemed to be of value equal to or higher than a master's thesis (such as academic books or peer-reviewed academic papers published in national academic society journals), and who is at least 24 years of age by March 31, 2027.

\* Note that applicants intending to apply under 7 or 8 above must undergo a preliminary review of eligibility to apply (see Section 10).

### 3 Application procedures

To apply to the cooperative doctoral course in subject development, please download the application guidelines and required forms from the Aichi University of Education or the cooperative doctoral course in subject development website, print them out, and complete the forms yourself. The prescribed forms are common to both universities.

#### 【Supplementary information regarding application documents】

- (1) If the prescribed cover sheets to be attached to each application document are insufficient, please make additional copies as needed.
- (2) All application documents must be completed in Japanese. However, international applicants whose primary language is English may complete the documents in English.
- (3) When a certificate, etc. is in a language other than English, a translation into Japanese must also be submitted.
- (4) For items ⑧⑨⑩⑪⑫⑬, make sure to include the required number of copies and fasten each group of copies together with a paper clip or double clip.
- (5) In cases where the applicant's name has changed since a document was issued, include a certificate that can be used to confirm the name change.
- (6) The applicant may be asked to submit additional documents as needed.

## 2. Payment of entrance examination fee

Entrance examination fee

By Thursday, September 24, 2026, please complete the payment at a Japan Post Bank or post office counter. Please fill in the applicant's name (in two places) and address (in one place) in the “Requester” section on the “Payment Slip” and the “Transfer Request and Receipt” available at Japan Post Bank or post offices and submit them together with cash at the counter. After making the payment, obtain the “Transfer Request and Receipt” bearing the official date stamp, affix it to the designated space on the proof of payment of the entrance examination fee form, and submit it together with the application documents. (The handling fee must be borne by the applicant.)  
However, applicants who are currently enrolled in a master's program or a

professional degree program at Aichi University of Education or Shizuoka University and who apply to the cooperative doctoral course in subject development, Graduate School of Education, Aichi University of Education / Shizuoka University, are exempt from the entrance examination fee.

In addition, if the applicant has been affected by a natural disaster or similar circumstances, the entrance examination fee may be waived in certain cases. In such cases, please inquire prior to application with the university at which the faculty member you wish to designate as your first-choice main advisor is affiliated.

The entrance examination fee will not be refunded, except in the following cases.

- (1) When the required documents were not submitted
- (2) For double payment of the examination fee
- (3) When the required documents were not accepted by the school
- (4) Applicants who are currently enrolled in a master's program or a professional degree program at Aichi University of Education or Shizuoka University and who apply to the cooperative doctoral course in subject development, graduate school of education, Aichi University of Education / Shizuoka University

\* How to Request a Refund of the examination fee

Create an "request for refund of the graduate school entrance examination fee" on appropriate paper (letter paper, etc.) and include the required seven items (see box below) on the form. Send the form together with the proof of payment (transfer application form and receipt) to the following address. ## 6. Other points to note when applying

- (1) No changes will be permitted after submission of the application documents.
- (2) Incomplete applications may not be accepted.
- (3) The documents submitted will not be returned.

## 7. Research advisors

Given the nature of the cooperative course, students in the doctoral course shall be assigned a main advisor as well as at least one assistant advisor from each university so that the student is conducting research under the guidance of three or more faculty members. faculty members who can act as main advisors are marked with a © in the list of full-time faculty members (Position and Degree) on pages 11 and 12. Please select a main advisor from among these faculty members and indicate the applicant on the Application for admission (the second choice can be left blank). It is possible to select a main advisor from either the home university or the cooperating university. Following enrollment, assistant advisors will be selected from among faculty members belonging to the Cooperative Doctoral Course in Subject Development under the guidance of the main advisor.

## 4 Prior consultations for applicants with disabilities or special needs

Applicants who wish to enroll in Aichi University of Education or Shizuoka University and who require special consideration during entrance examinations and/or their studies due to physical disabilities or other reasons, or who have concerns regarding such matters, must contact the inquiry office listed below by the consultation deadline.

If necessary, an interview with the applicant will be conducted at Aichi University of Education.

As some consultation requests may require time to arrange appropriate accommodation, applicants are advised to make an inquiry at an early stage prior to application.

## 6 Selection method

### 1. Selection method

Admission decisions are made based on a comprehensive evaluation of the application documents, an essay examination, a foreign language (English) written examination, and an oral examination. Applicants will be deemed unsuccessful if they fall under any of the following categories:

- (1) If the total score of the essay examination, foreign language (English) written examination, and oral examination is less than 200 points.
- (2) If the score for any one of the essay examination, foreign language (English) written examination, or oral examination is less than 20% of the full score.

(Note 1) If the entrance examinations are postponed in the event of bad weather, etc., notification will be posted on the Aichi University of Education website <https://www.aichi-edu.ac.jp/> by 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, November 7, 2026. In such a case, the examinations will instead be held the next day, Sunday, November 8, 2026.

## 3. Content of entrance examination and scoring

### (1) Essay (100 points)

An essay on an education-related theme.

### (2) Foreign language (English) written examination (100 points)

A test of English proficiency as required for research in terms of education (the use of paper or electronic dictionaries will be allowed (Note 1)).

### (3) Oral examination (Note 2) (200 points)

Focused on research to date and future research plans, etc. After entering the course.

(Note 1) Electronic dictionaries with the following functions may not be used:

- translation functions (i.e., those capable of translating sentences)
- scanning functions
- Wi-Fi connectivity

In addition, the use of voice input/output functions during the examination is not permitted.

Furthermore, electronic dictionaries that are deemed inappropriate by the Chair of the Admissions Examination Committee may not be used.

### 3. Important Notes

- (1) If revisions to fees are made at the time of admission or while enrolled, the revised admission fee, enrollment fees, and tuition will apply from the time of revision.

- (2) Information regarding payment methods for the admission fee, enrollment fees, and tuition will be provided in the Enrollment Procedures Guidelines sent to successful applicants.
- (3) The admission fee and enrollment fees must be paid by the enrollment procedure deadline.
- (4) Tuition for the first semester must be paid in April 2027.
- (5) Applicants who are currently enrolled in a master's program or a professional degree program at Aichi University of Education, or in a master's program or a professional degree program at Shizuoka University, and who will continue their studies in the Cooperative Doctoral Course in Subject Development from April 2027 are exempt from the admission fee.
- (6) Japanese Government (MEXT) scholarship students are exempt from the admission fee and tuition; however, Enrollment fees are required.
- (7) The admission fee already paid will not be refunded even if an applicant withdraws admission by March 31, 2027.
- (8) Each university has its own regulations regarding admission fee exemptions and related matters. For details, please contact the university at which you will be enrolled.

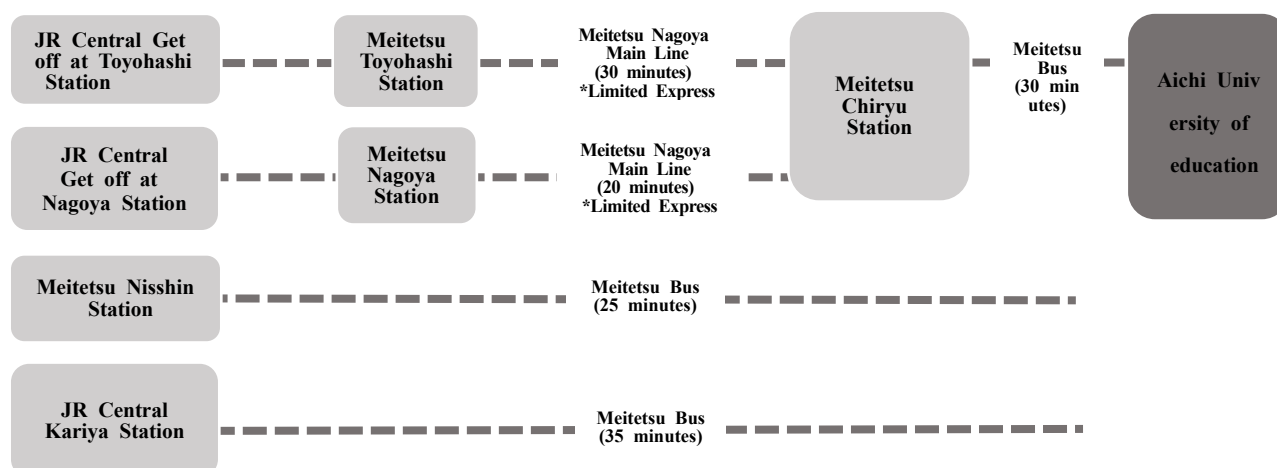
